BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR
COUNTY OF CAPE MAY

ORDINANCE NO. 1373

CALENDAR YEAR 2011
ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION
LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK
(N.J.S.A 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2011 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 327,577.53 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2011 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Stone Harbor shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$327,577.53, and that the CY 2011 municipal budget for the Borough of Stone Harbor be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 1374**

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF 95TH STREET

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, Cape May County, New Jersey has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to vacate a portion of 95th Street in connection with the construction of a Free Public Library by the County of Cape May;

WHEREAS, vacation of a public street, or part thereof, may be authorized by the municipal governing body by Ordinance pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-1, et seq., in the discretion of the governing body to accommodate public uses or when there is no longer any need for the use of said area by the public; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is the owner of all property adjacent to the area to be vacated and will not be relinquishing such ownership or title by way of the vacation of the street area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, Cape May County and State of New Jersey, duly assembled in public session, as follows:

1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-1, et seq., all public right and interest in the portion of 95th Street particularly described on Schedule "A" attached hereto is hereby vacated, abandoned, and released as follows:
2. Pursuant to law, inasmuch as the Borough is the owner of all contiguous lands, the vacated area shall revert to the Borough. The Mayor, Solicitor and Clerk shall be and hereby are authorized to take all steps necessary to record all required documents to effectuate this vacation.
3. All rights and privileges now possessed by any public utility or cable television company, to maintain, repair and/or replace their existing facilities in, adjacent, over or under the vacated area of 95th Street are hereby expressly reserved and excepted from this vacation.
4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed as to their inconsistencies only.
5. The Borough Clerk shall, within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Ordinance, file a copy hereof, certified by the Clerk, under seal of the Borough, to be a true and exact copy of the Ordinance, together with a copy of the proof of publication thereof, in the Office of the Cape May County Clerk for recordation in the County's Book of "Vacations," pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-21. This ordinance being one of special and limited application shall not be required to be recorded in the Revised General Ordinances book of the Borough of Stone Harbor.

This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication of final adoption.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 205 OF THE REVISED GENERAL
ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR 2005
(ADDING RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS)

Section 1. Chapter 205 – 1A (1) is hereby amended by adding the following:

(1) Specifically mentioned as a permitted use within the residential district, business districts or light industry districts in Chapter 560, Zoning, of the Code of the Borough of Stone Harbor.

Section 2. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CREATING CHAPTER 78 OF THE REVISED
GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR 2005
(ELIMINATING RETIREE HEALTH BENEFITS
FOR CERTAIN NEWLY HIRED EMPLOYEES)

Section 1. Chapter 78, Section 78-1, is hereby amended as follows:

"All employees who were hired on or before May 17, 2011 and who are not covered by a collective bargaining agreement, who retire from the Borough of Stone Harbor, who upon retirement have at least 25 years of service credit in the New Jersey State Retirement System, and who have been employed by the Borough of Stone Harbor for at least 25 years immediately prior to the date of their retirement, and who have attained the age of 55 years shall, for themselves and their spouses, continue to receive the same health benefits afforded to full-time employees until such time as such retiree and/or his or her spouse qualifies for Medicare. Once the retiree qualifies for Medicare, the Borough will continue to supply the necessary supplemental insurance to Medicare to provide, as near as practicable, similar coverage to that of benefits of full-time Borough employees."

Section 2. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 10 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR 2005 (ESTABLISHING ATTENDANCE AND ETHICS TRAINING REQUIREMENTS)

Section 1. Chapter 10 is hereby amended as follows:

§ 10-4 Resignation and Vacancies and Attendance of Mayor and Council and Appointed Member of Various Municipal Boards and Committees: Ethics Training Requirements

[A and B, no change]
[new section, C]

C. Attendance Requirements

It is resolved by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May, and State of New Jersey that an Attendance Policy is hereby adopted in the Borough of Stone Harbor applicable to all elected officials and appointed members of any municipally created board or committee.

1. Attendance at meetings required; removal

In the event that any elected and/or appointed member shall fail to attend three consecutive, regular, scheduled meetings, then a motion to remove that member(s) shall be automatically placed on the agenda for the next regular meeting without further notice, and should the vote be to remove the member, the member's seat shall become vacant until a replacement is appointed as required by state or local law.

2. Percentage of meetings required.

In the event that any member shall fail to attend to at least 70% of the annually scheduled regular meetings in a given year, then that member(s) shall be automatically removed at the end of the calendar year (i.e., December 31) without further notice, and the member's seat shall become vacant until a replacement is appointed as required by state or local law.

3. Medical absences exempted.

Only significant medical absences/hospitalization for the member or an immediate family member shall be accepted in lieu of attendance on regular meeting dates. Such absences shall not be considered in a determination for removal as outlined above.

D. Ethics training required

The elected officials subject to this article shall within six months of their election and on at least a bi-annual basis thereafter participate in ethics training. Such training courses shall be arranged through the Borough Administrator.

Section 2. If any portion of this ordinance is determined to be invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

SELF EXAMINATION OF THE BUDGET 2011

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A 40A: 4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1979; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.2 thru 7.5 the Borough of Stone Harbor has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and Chief Finance Officer has determined that the local government meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2011 budget year.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for uncollected taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (complies with the "Cap" law).
3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated.
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form arrangement and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised, and in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

Section 275-4. Exceptions.

A Special Events sponsored solely by the Borough of Stone Harbor are exempt from the payment of the fee for a special event permit. Such special events shall be governed by applicable Borough policies. Additionally, Borough Council retains the discretion to waive any provision of this chapter where deemed appropriate in the sole discretion of the Borough Council.
