ORDINANCE NO.

CALENDAR YEAR 2011 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A:4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.0% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2011 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$ 327,577.53 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2011 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Stone Harbor shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$327,577.53, and that the CY 2011 municipal budget for the Borough of Stone Harbor be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR CAPE MAY COUNTY ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE VACATING A PORTION OF PORTION OF 95TH STREET

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, Cape May County, New Jersey has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to vacate a portion of 95th Street in connection with the construction of a Free Public Library by the County of Cape May;

WHEREAS, vacation of a public street, or part thereof, , may be authorized by the municipal governing body by Ordinance pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-1, et seq., in the discretion of the governing body to accommodate public uses or when there is no longer any need for the use of said area by the public; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is the owner of all property adjacent to the area to be vacated and will not be relinquishing such ownership or title by way of the vacation of the street area.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, Cape May County and State of New Jersey, duly assembled in public session, as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-1, et seq., all public right and interest in the portion of 95th Street particularly described on Schedule "A" attached hereto is hereby vacated, abandoned, and released as follows:
- 2. Pursuant to law, inasmuch as the Borough is the owner of all contiguous lands, the vacated area shall revert to the Borough. The Mayor, Solicitor and Clerk shall be and hereby are authorized to take all steps necessary to record all required documents to effectuate this vacation.
- 3. All rights and privileges now possessed by any public utility or cable television company, to maintain, repair and/or replace their existing facilities in, adjacent, over or under the vacated area of 95th Street are hereby expressly reserved and excepted from this vacation.
- 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent with this ordinance are repealed as to their inconsistencies only.
- 5. The Borough Clerk shall, within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this Ordinance, file a copy hereof, certified by the Clerk, under seal of the Borough, to be a true and exact copy of the Ordinance, together with a copy of the proof of publication thereof, in the Office of the Cape May County Clerk for recordation in the County's Book of "Vacations," pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:67-21. This ordinance being one of special and limited application shall not be required to be recorded in the Revised General Ordinances book of the Borough of Stone Harbor.

This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after publication of final adoption.

SCHEDULE A

DESCRIPTION PORTION OF NINETY-FIFTH STREET TO BE VACATED LOCATED IN THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR

ALL that certain lot tract or parcel of land and premises situate, lying and being in the Borough of Stone Harbor, County of Cape May and State of New Jersey. Being more particularly bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the southeasterly line of First Avenue (70 feet wide) with the northeasterly line of Ninety-Fifth Street (presently 60 feet wide) as shown in plan entitled "Existing Conditions, Lots 9, 11 & 13, Block 94.01, Proposed Library Site, Stone Harbor, Cape May County, New Jersey" as prepared by the Office Of The Cape May County Engineer on 11/02/07 and revised to 03/01/11 (copy attached). From said point of beginning;

- 1) South, 56 degrees, 38 minutes and 00 seconds East, along the present and aforementioned northeasterly line of Ninety-Fifth Street, two-hundred and thirty-five and zero one-hundredths (235.00) feet to a point in the northwesterly line of a 10 feet wide Bulkhead Right of Way as shown on said plan, thence;
- 2) South, 33 degrees, 22 minutes and 00 seconds West, at right angles to the previous course, and along the northwesterly line of the aforesaid 10 feet wide Bulkhead Right of Way, fifteen and zero one-hundredths (15.00) feet to a point, thence;
- 3) North, 56 degrees, 38 minutes and 00 seconds West, parallel with and fifteen (15) feet distant from the first course herein when measured at right angles thereto and parallel with and fifteen (15) feet northeast of the centerline of the said Ninety-Fifth Street when measured at right angles thereto, two-hundred and thirty-five and zero one-hundredths (235.00) feet to the aforementioned southeasterly line of First Avenue, thence;
- 4) North, 33 degrees, 22 minutes and 00 seconds East, at right angles to the previous course and along the said southeasterly line of First Avenue, fifteen and zero one-hundredths (15.00) feet to the point and place of beginning.

Containing within the above described premises 3,525 square feet more or less.
