RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, RATIFYING AND CONFIRMING THE SALE OF AN OFFERING OF \$12,750,000 GENERAL BONDS OF 2011 AND \$1,620,000 WATER AND SEWER BONDS OF 2011 OF THE BOROUGH.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The award by James G. Nicola, as the Chief Financial Officer of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey (the "Borough"), of the offering of \$14,370,000 Bonds of 2011 consisting of \$12,750,000 General Bonds of 2011 and \$1,620,000 Water and Sewer Bonds of 2011 (collectively, the "Bonds") of the Borough, dated November 9, 2011, to Janney Montgomery Scott LLC, as the low bidder therefor, at the net interest rate of 2.870667% per annum and at the price of \$14,423,186.39 is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed in every respect. The Bonds were awarded pursuant to authority of the resolution of the governing body of the Borough adopted September 17, 2011 and entitled: "Resolution determining the form and other details of \$12,750,000 General Bonds of 2011 and \$1,620,000 Water and Sewer Bonds of 2011 of the Borough of Stone Harbor, in the County of Cape May, New Jersey, and providing for their sale".

DISCUSSION: ORDINANCE ZONING CHANGES

Councilmember Cope reported that a Sub-Committee of the Planning Board was created over a year ago to address the updating of the Borough's Zoning Ordinance. Councilmember Cope stated that the Ordinance was outdated and difficult to use. Councilmember Cope stated that the Committee consisted of him, Carl Wannan, Andrew Catanese, Planning Board Solicitor, and Joanne Mascia, Zoning Official, and recently Councilmember Carusi. Councilmember Cope explained that there are no substantive changes. Councilmember Cope asked Mr. Catanese to come up and explain the changes.

Mr. Catanese said when the process began the idea was to get into this document in anticipation of subsequently coming back and incorporating the master plan changes. They started with the Master Plan from a couple of years ago, and it seemed in the view of the Planning Board, that taking those changes and incorporating them into a zoning ordinance that had already some problems was not the way to go. There were some antiquated provisions, things that needed to be cleaned up, and this was a good time to go ahead and do that first. The committee got into the process with an eye toward not making any significant substantive changes, and for the most part that was done. There were a few changes which may be categorized as substantive but only to

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the extent that it was necessary to make them consistent with State Law. There are no incorporation of master plan changes, that is something that has been discussed as Phase II of this project. Councilmember Kramar asked if Phase II would be the time when Council or the public can suggest changes. Mr. Catanese said yes, the plan would be for it to follow the same course this proposed ordinance did, which would be a planning board initiative, recommendations to subcommittees, they would start to come up with proposals, which would do a number of things, such as taking the recommendations of the planning board, putting them into codified form, and proposed amendments and then vetting them at the planning board and based on Planning Board recommendations, the proposal would then come to Council for final consideration. Administrator Hawk said he sits on the Planning Board and when this next Phase II has been discussed, they are major Zoning changes and will follow the Master Plan, as far as creating new areas. These changes will not be brought back to Council in a lump, each individual section will be brought back to Council to be debated and there will only be one issue on the table at a time. These changes will be more controversial and you will hear from some people in favor and some opposed. Councilmember Cope said some of the issues identified for Phase II include Light Industrial District, Marina District, Multifamily Residential District, and addressing the neighborhood Commercial District, which include the two satellite business districts at Buds' Market and Clarkes Market. They are all currently in the same zoning category as the Central Business District but their needs and uses are different. A recent issue is how to address a hotel, motel district, to make it a separate district or a conditional use. The Planning Board will assign responsibility for each of these major areas and they will come back one at a time for consideration .
