MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION OF MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STONE HARBOR HELD IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, DECEMBER 6, 2011

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Walters at 4:30 p.m.

Mayor Walters announced that the meeting was now open. Adequate notice of the meeting was provided by posting a copy of the time and place on the Municipal Clerk's bulletin board and mailing a copy of same to the Press and the Cape May County Herald on January 5, 2011.

DOCK HEARING – 9917 Sunset Drive – Joseph and Diana Naselli

For the record, Solicitor Donohue stated that he would swear in Mr. Deneka; however, if there are issues with this application, it would need to be continued because his brother is the contractor requesting the permit and he would have a conflict. Solicitor Donohue swore in Tom Deneka of Stone Harbor Surveyors on behalf of Joseph and Diana Naselli.

Mr. Deneka stated that he represents the property owners who applied to the Building Department to replace decking and railing on the existing fixed pier. Mr. Deneka stated that a Determination of Qualification for exemption from the Waterfront Development Permit Requirements has been granted by the Department of Environmental Protection.

Mayor Walters asked if there was anyone in the audience to speak for or against the application.

Councilmember Kramar inquired if the applicant would be using vinyl or wood. Mr. Deneka responded that he did not know what materials the applicants would be using to replace the decks and rails. Councilmember Carusi inquired why was this applicant denied by the Construction Office and was advised that this is standard procedure.

To approve the application for 9917 Sunset Drive on behalf of applicants, Joseph and Diana Naselli, in accordance with the drawings prepared by Stone Harbor Surveyors dated September 28, 2011.

PUBLIC COMMENT

No one from the public commented.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mayor Walters stated that the first item of Old Business is Ordinance No. 1393 – Easement for the Geothermal Field for the Library. Mayor Walters stated that Steve O'Connor, Dale Foster and Kent Schellenger from the County were here tonight to give an update on the Library. Mr. Foster explained that the Library had to be relocated to accommodate the NJ DEP Coastal Scenic Resources and Design Policy. Mr. Schellenger explained that the placement of the building needs to be twice the height of the building from the beach or dune. The proposed building is

37.67' high, so the building needs to be set back 75.33 feet from the dune. The DEP has accepted the toe of dune line interpretation as measured by the County Engineer (minimum 34 feet east of bulkhead) and the building has been moved landward to a point 79 feet from the landward toe of dune. The parking area on the Library site has been redesigned to accommodate 38 parking spaces in front of the building with the possibility of adding another 10 spaces if parking is placed on the ocean side of the Library. The existing lot had 82 spaces for a net reduction of 34 spaces. The existing Borough lot to the south has been redesigned by converting RV spaces to conventional auto spaces, redesigning the handicap parking spaces and eliminating some drive aisles to increase the existing number of spaces to offset the loss of spaces under the Library building. If parking on the ocean side of the Library is acceptable, the final number of spaces will be within a few spaces of the number of spaces currently provided by the parking lots. The geothermal field will be located under the lots fronting on First Avenue. The wells are underground and will not impact the use of the parking lot. The relocation of the building had a slight impact on the geothermal well field and the field can be adjusted within the area designated for the geothermal well field. The Library project can be built without the geothermal field; however, without the geothermal field, the building would need to be heated and cooled with natural gas and would lose its LEED Silver Classification.

Mr. Hawk inquired about holding another Public Hearing since it was already held on November 14, 2011. Mr. Donohue stated that it is his legal opinion that the Borough should hold another Public Hearing tonight.

Vincent Lamanna – Golden Gate Drive – read a letter he recently sent to Barbara Bakely-Marino, Esquire, Cape May County Counsel, indicating that he believes that the changes made to the plans for the Library are substantial and as such requires Planning Board Review pursuant to Section 31 of the Municipal Land Use Law. Mr. Lamanna requested Council to send this back to the Planning Board and start from square one as far as this Ordinance goes.

Karen Lane – 10310 First Avenue – 10310 Fist Avenue – inquired why we are giving the County more and more time and requested Council to drop this project. Mrs. Lane stated that as of the beginning of last week, there was no application on file with the DEP for permits for this project. Mrs. Lane stated that the residents don't want this library at this location and Stone Harbor does not need a 14,000 square foot library. Mrs. Lane read a recent newspaper article about Books A Million and their survey of people in the Mays Landing area. Mrs. Lane urged Council not to vote on this Ordinance tonight. Mrs. Lane had some questions about the setbacks and whether the Borough is planning on notifying all the residents in this area about the plans. Mrs. Lane was advised that the Borough does not need a variance from the Zoning Board; therefore, it does not have to notify the residents and that this building meets the Borough's Zoning Ordinances.

RESOLUTION 2011-S-173 – Modification to Library Lease

Councilmember Vaul inquired about the addendum. Mr. Donohue explained that the addendum provides for two changes, i.e., adding Lot 17 and a deadline for the County to start construction said deadline being January 20, 2012. Mr. Donohue explained that this addendum still needs to go to the Library Commission for their approval. Councilmember Kramar inquired why was January 20, 2012 chosen as the deadline. Mayor Walters stated that with the changes made to the plans, the project now meets all the DEP's requirements and 45 days from today is a reasonable amount of time for the permits to be issued.

APPROVING ADDENDUM #2 TO A LEASE WITH THE CAPE MAY COUNTY LIBRARY COMMISSION DATED NOVEMBER 30, 2007

WHEREAS, the Cape May County Library Commission (CMCLC) and the Borough of Stone Harbor (Borough) entered into a lease of certain real property within the Borough for the construction of a Stone Harbor branch of the Cape May County Library, said lease being dated November 30, 2007, and on file with the Borough Clerk; and

WHEREAS, it has been four years since the execution the lease, and no construction has occurred on the property; and

WHEREAS, despite successive assurances over the course of the past four years that permits would be forthcoming and that construction would commence, no construction has started at the premises and the project continues to be delayed; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is now informed by the CMCLC that the footprint of the building must be relocated and the plans revised in order to comply with the requirements imposed by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP); and

WHEREAS, despite previous assurances, the Borough is informed that only by relocation of the building can the necessary permits be obtained; and

WHEREAS, this change requires that Lot 17 in Block 94.01 be added to the "premises" described in the aforementioned lease and the CMCLC has requested Addendum #2 to the lease to add said lot to the "premises";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey, duly assembled in public session this 6th day of December, 2011, as follows:

- 1. The preamble of this Resolution is incorporated here by reference;
- 2. The delay of four years from the execution of the lease to this point in time without any construction commencing upon the premises has been discussed by the governing body as unreasonable and it is hereby formally resolved that such delay has been and is unreasonable and to the detriment of the citizens of the Borough of Stone Harbor;
- 3. The aforementioned delay has resulted, in large part, from the extreme and unforseen difficulty on the part of the CMCLC in obtaining environmental permits;
- 4. This unreasonable delay cannot persist further and the project must immediately commence construction or the lease be terminated since it appears that performance by either party may be impossible due to the inability of the CMCLC to obtain NJDEP permits.
- 5. Any grant of a second addendum to the lease shall be conditioned upon all necessary permits being obtained and construction commencing upon the premises on or before January 20, 2012, and Addendum #2 has been drafted accordingly;
- 6. That the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute Addendum #2 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference, for the purposes aforesaid;

7. That the Borough Clerk shall transmit Addendum #2 to the CMCLC for approval by the Board of the Commission at their meeting of December 21, 2011.

AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL TO APPROVE THE REQUEST FOR MODIFICATION OF MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT WITH THE NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, OFFICE OF MARITIME RESOURCES FOR THE RELOCATION OF SITE 103/NUMMY ISLAND – PLANNING AND ENGINEERING

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Office of Maritime Resources has agreed to develop, implement and maintain a comprehensive dredging and dredged material management and disposal plan for navigable waters of the State; and

WHEREAS, the attached Memorandum of Agreement with the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Office of Maritime Resources, outlines the issue agreed upon between the New Jersey Department of Transportation, Office of Maritime Resources and the Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Stone Harbor has requested a modification to the agreement due to an increased and unanticipated number of sediment samples required and related unforeseen costs; and

WHEREAS, the modification will cover these additional costs, which are currently estimated to be up to \$190,000; and

WHEREAS, the existing cost sharing formula would remain in effect at 90% NJDOT and 10% Borough of Stone Harbor; and

WHEREAS, in order for the Borough to continue to participate in this program, the Mayor and Council must approve this request for modification.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor, duly assembled in public session this 6th day of December, 2011, as follows:

- 1. That the preamble of this Resolution is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth in length.
- 2. That the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Stone Harbor hereby approve the request for modification outlined in the attached letter to the State of New Jersey, DOT, Office of Maritime Resources and dated December 6, 2011.

DISCUSSION:

Councilmember Kramar thanked Public Works for installing the lights along Second Avenue and stated that they look beautiful.

Councilmember Vaul stated that all Committees other than Natural Resources and Public Safety have submitted Operating and Expense (O & E) budgets that are flat (no increase from 2011). Councilmember Carusi explained that in previous years the Duffield contract was incorporated into the Capital Budget as part of the Bird Sanctuary Rejuvenation Project and since the project is complete, the Duffield fees for continuing to monitor and prepare reports will be part of the O & E budget. Councilmember Carusi stated that Duffield originally submitted a contract for \$44,000.00 and has recently reduced that fee to \$34,000.00, but the Committee is still working on negotiating the terms and fees. Councilmember Kramar stated that the Water and Sewer O & E budget is up about \$1,000.00 because the price of chemicals has increased significantly. Councilmember Cope stated that there are only two (2) line items which have increased and they are \$2,500 for a maintenance contract on the finger printing system and \$1,500 for tuition and training for new sergeants.
