The meeting was called to order by Mayor Walters at 4:30 p.m.

Mayor Walters announced that the meeting was now open. Adequate notice of the meeting was provided by posting a copy of the time and place on the Municipal Clerk's bulletin board and mailing a copy of same to the Press and the Cape May County Herald on January 5, 2012.

911 ARTIFACT CONCEPTUAL DESIGN PRESENTATION

Councilmember Kramar stated that it is with great pleasure to announce some of the members of the volunteer Committee as follows: Mayor Suzanne Walters, Administrator Jill Gougher, Councilmember Joselyn Rich, Police Chief Paul Reynolds, Fire Chief Roger Stanford, Greg Sheeran and Grant Russ from Public Works, Cy Myers representing the American Legion, and two members from the public who were in New York on that fateful day are Jane Rakestraw, VP of Saks 5th Avenue and Charles Boylan, an executive with Marsh McCellan whose company lost 330 of their staff, Marc DeBlasio, Borough Engineer, Scott Taylor, VP of Taylor Design Group, and herself as Chair. Councilmember Kramar explained that she began the process of obtaining one of the last remaining artifacts from the site of the World Trade Center from the Port Authority of New York/New Jersey almost a year ago and that she was able to acquire a section of an I-beam for the Borough which will be the focal point of this memorial project. Councilmember Kramar stated that Committee considered eight different locations for the memorial and the Committee agreed that the ideal location would be 123rd Street which was the suggestion of Mayor Walters. Councilmember Kramar reported that the artifact will be displayed on Tuesday, September 11, 2012 at 123rd Site Location with an honor guard, police and firemen and there will be a short dedication ceremony at 1:00 p.m. Councilmember Kramar stated that the design proposal from Taylor Design Group is reverent, peaceful and will pay an everlasting tribute to the men and women who lost their lives nearly 11 years ago. Councilmember Kramar stated the memorial should be completed by September 11, 2013 and will provide a quiet place of pause and reflection for residents and visitors. Councilmember Kramar introduced Scott Taylor of Taylor Design Group, who presented Council with a draft design which will be located near the municipal parking lot at 123rd Street. Mr. Scott explained that the artifact will be placed on a cast stone base and under a curved trellis and a walk through at the memorial will connect to the sidewalk on the west side. Mr. Scott explained that as part of the memorial, a globe constructed of brushed aluminum or stainless steel will be illuminated at night with very small red LED lights identifying New York City, Washington, DC and Shanksville, PA and there will be benches with low ground cover plantings for comfort and aesthetic value. Mr. Scott stated that this memorial will provide a place for pause, reflection, and remembrance and was designed to complement the architecture and essence of Stone Harbor. Councilmembers thanked Mr. Scott and Councilmember Kramar and Committee members for working on this special project and commented that the design is beautiful. Councilmember Mastrangelo inquired if a budget had been established yet. Councilmember Kramar responded that there is a small budget right now and new money will be allocated in the 2013 budget and the Committee is considering a sponsorship for people that would like to donate to this project as well as private donations which can be sent directly to Jill Gougher, Borough Administrator. Charlie Tomlinson – 269 106th Street – stated that the design is beautiful, but maybe we should consider focusing on the artifact more than the globe which appears to be the center of attention. Lou Schweickhardt- requested that the port-of-potties in that location be upgraded. Mr. Boylan commented on behalf of March McCellan that this memorial is very special and all the people on the Committee had significant input and thanked each of them and Councilmember Kramar especially.

Councilmember Kramar reported that the design concept will be on display at the dedication ceremony on September 11, 2012 and will also be on the Borough's website.

CENTENNIAL BOOK PRESENTATION

Mayor Walters introduced Jeff Alderton, President of the ROA and Sherry Tomlinson, Secretary of the ROA. Mr. Alderton stated that the Book Committee consists of himself, Sherry, Barb Hencheck Art Faint, and Terri Cwik. Mr. Alderton stated that the ROA would like to own the creation, development, marketing, PR, and bookkeeping of the Centennial Book. Mr. Alderton stated that a mock-up book should be available by the fall of 2013 in anticipation of sales for the holiday season and should be available for early winter or spring of 2014. Mr. Adlerton envisions the book will be a coffee table style book and it will be about a Stone Harbor experience and will be as relevant as possible for the current buyer. Sherry Tomlinson explained that the book is mostly structured by decades with four threads weaving through it which are: 1) A family resort image including such things as the 4th of July Parade, Christmas Parade, fireworks, love of Country and downtown pride; 2) Organizations such as the ROA, Garden Club, American Legion, Civic Club, Lions Club, etc.; 3) Beaches, Bays and Natural Resources; and 4) Buildings and Businesses. Mrs. Tomlinson indicated that the ROA will produce, market and distribute this book, which will be called "The Stone Harbor *Experience*" and the ROA is providing the start-up money to engage the publisher, Exit Zero, and the rest of the money for the book will come from sponsorships and the sale of the book itself. Mrs. Tomlinson stated that the price of the book has not been finalized; the ROA has partnered with the Stone Harbor Museum and Terri Cwik; the ROA is training docents and volunteers to do research work; planned for approximately 6 writers and 1 chief editor; and thanks to Jim Fisher, Chairman of the Borough's Centennial Committee, they now have storage and work space above Sturdy Bank; Mr. Alderton sent out a request to all members asking for volunteers to help with the writing, advertising, and all the other projects required to produce this book and the same request has been placed on Channel 2; and the creation of a Facebook Page. Mrs. Tomlinson requested permission to have a drop box in Borough Hall so that people can drop off memorabilia. Mrs. Tomlinson stated that when the project is completed, the ROA will turn over everything to the Museum and any profits after the ROA's expenses have been paid will be given to the Museum as well. Mayor Walters stated that the book sounds terrific and she is looking forward to the final product. Mayor Walters stated that it should be no problem to have a drop box at Borough Hall and Councilmember Kramar suggested that the ROA also put a drop box at the Chamber of Commerce so that items can be dropped off at a different location when Borough Hall is not open. Mr. Alderton stated that he is concerned about copyright laws and asked for Michael Donohue's legal expertise. Mr. Alderton stated that the book will have one price and any business that sells that book will only be able to charge the exact book price. Mayor and Council expressed thanks to the ROA for taking on this tremendous responsibility and for doing such an incredible job thus far.

PUBLIC COMMENT

John Hencheck -32794^{th} Street - stated that Cape May County produces 15% of the State's tourism revenues and suggested that we capitalize on the commitment of Governor Christie to assist towns in the area of tourism especially in the shoulder season. Mr. Hencheck suggested that the Police Department have a lock box so that people can drop off medications they are no longer taking.

Sandy Slavek – Sunset Drive – inquired about the hours at the Recreation Support Building. Councilmember Davies-Dunhour stated that the building is closed so that the contractor can finish up work on the building including the installation of collapsible doors, etc and that work should be completed by September 14, 2012.

Bob Ashman – 10301 First Avenue – inquired about the Borough's plan to purchase the Bank of America Building. Mr. Donohue stated that it is an issue the Mayor and Council are discussing and working on and a matter of which will be considered Closed Session material until the appropriate time.
